A senior police officer described the damage the scams do. He said these crimes destroy lives. He said the emotional damage is usually bigger than the financial loss. He advised people to never give money to strangers. He said: "Never give money to people you meet online, no matter what emotional sob story the person uses." He added that people should always be on their guard online.
