bullet trains are called shinkansen in japan they started in 1964 in time for the tokyo olympics they became an iconic symbol of japan and were the worlds fastest trains they currently reach speeds of 320kph the bullet train rail network has expanded to currently consist of 2764km people take around 350 million rides a year on the shinkansen a shinkansen president yuji fukasawa spoke about the flooded trains he said the floodwater seriously damaged their motors and braking systems the total cost of the damage is around 135 million he said for stability and safety we will replace the trains with newly built ones instead of repairing them
