The lead researcher said rivers which have the most economic development near them, like the Mississippi river or River Thames, are the most strongly impacted. The leastimpacted are in Africa and Australia. This is because of fewer factories in Africa and smaller populations around rivers in Australia. He said rivers in rich nations are totally different to how they were 200 years ago.
