Mr Brown said: "Any caring and compassionate chancellor would want to do something about this poverty....You cannot ignore the needs of parents who are having to choose between putting their heating up and feeding their children." He added that it was urgent for the chancellor to act, or the ruling Conservative Party will be known as the "nasty" party. Further price hikes and food shortages are on the horizon as the war in Ukraine will see the price of wheat rise. Government critics are calling for a oneoff "windfall tax" on the huge profits of energy companies to help the disadvantaged.
