mr sanchez said spain would soon adopt urgent energysaving measures to tackle the climate crisis and to reduce its reliance on russian gas many other european countries are doing what they can to be less dependent on russia for fuel in the wake of the ukraine war it is as yet unclear what actions mr sanchez will take to save energy his government has already set restrictions on the use of air conditioners and heating appliances in the workplace the recent heatwaves and rising energy prices have taken their toll on spain more than 500 people have passed away in the past two weeks because of the heat spain has also introduced a relief package of 92 billion to help people pay energy bills
